An interesting combination of new and neutral oak barrels combined with low alcohol showcases the really pretty fruit even more. The warm tannins are just behind the wild berry taste which gives a nice backbone and strength to the blend. The layers of dark fruit go on forever. This is truly a palate pleasing wine.
